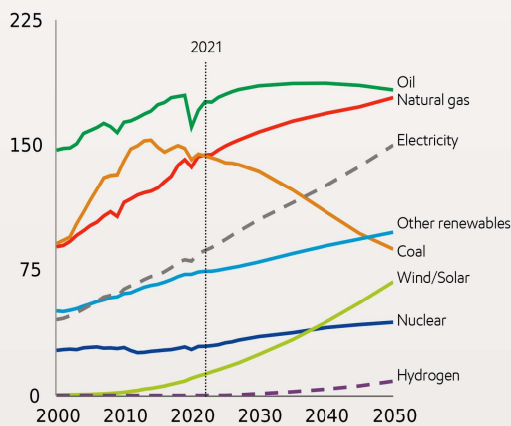

Global Outlook

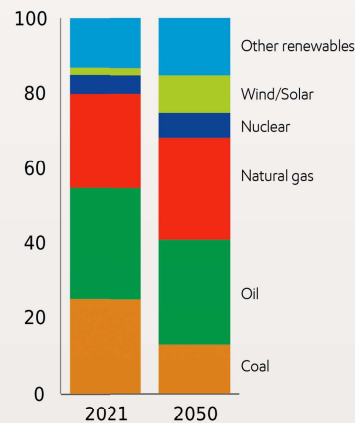
Global electricity generation is expected to reach 31 trillion kilowatt-hours in 2026 from 28.5 trillion kilowatt-hours in 2021, growing at a rate of 1.5 percent each year.

Rising prosperity and expanding commercial activity leads to a more than 15% increase in energy demand. Strong middle-class growth in developing nations increases energy demand by about 35%. Improving building efficiencies reduce energy demand in developed countries by about 15% by 2050.

Primary energy – Quadrillion Btu



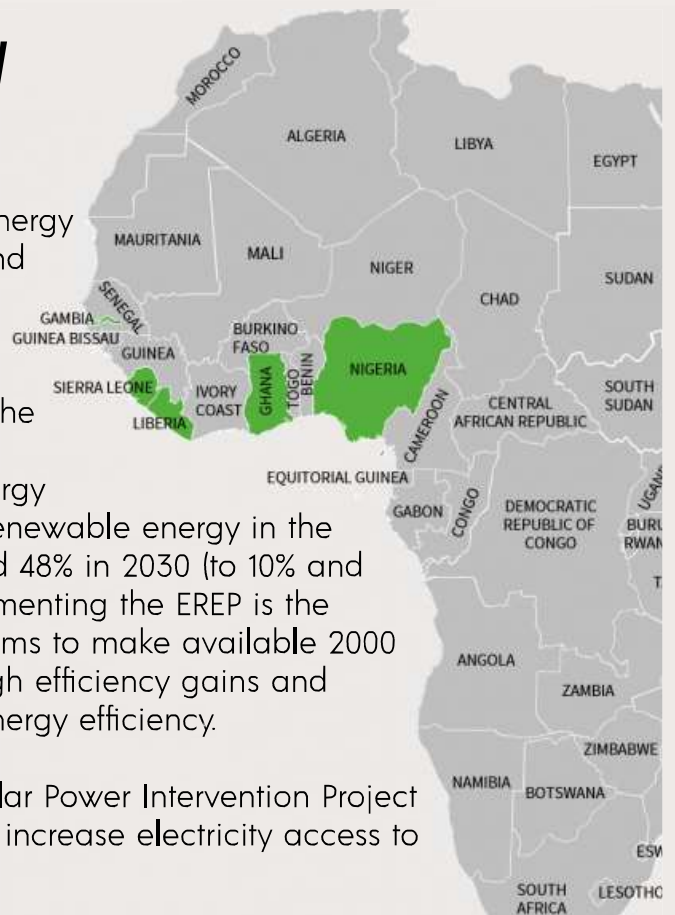
Percent of primary energy



Accelerating Access to Energy Sector in West Africa

The West African region has a vast renewable energy potential sufficient to cover unmet power demand and achieve universal access to electricity while supporting the region's transition to a low-carbon growth path. In July 2013 the Authority of Heads of State and Government of the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) adopted the ECOWAS Renewable Energy Policy (EREP); this aims to increase the share of renewable energy in the region's overall electricity mix to 35% in 2020 and 48% in 2030 (to 10% and 19%, respectively, excluding large hydro). Complementing the EREP is the ECOWAS Energy Efficiency Policy (EEEP), which aims to make available 2000 megawatts of power generation capacity through efficiency gains and ultimately double the rate of improvements in energy efficiency.

Activities under the new Regional Emergency Solar Power Intervention Project (RESPITE) have officially kicked off in Freetown to increase electricity access to millions of existing and prospective



consumers in Chad, Liberia, Sierra Leone, and Togo. RESPITE – a \$311 million regional project supported by the World Bank and approved on December 20, 2022, with legal agreements signed today – aims to rapidly increase grid-connected renewable energy capacity and strengthen regional integration in the participating countries.

West Africa has one of the lowest electrification rates, with 220 million people living without access, coupled with some of the highest electricity costs in Sub-Saharan Africa. Rising oil prices – as a consequence of the war in Ukraine – have increased the liabilities of electricity utilities, and countries are facing an acute power supply crisis that threatens their economic growth. Furthermore, countries in the region rely on oil-based power plants to meet growing demand. In addition to the negative impact on the climate, this leads to increasingly higher tariffs for consumers.

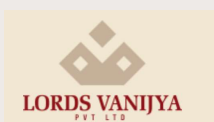

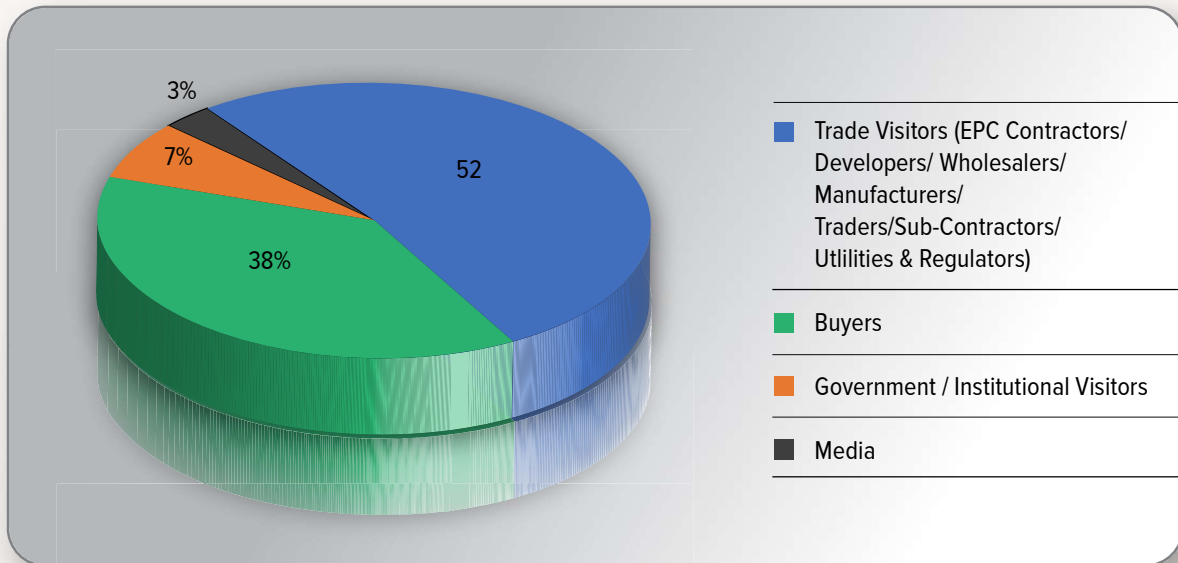

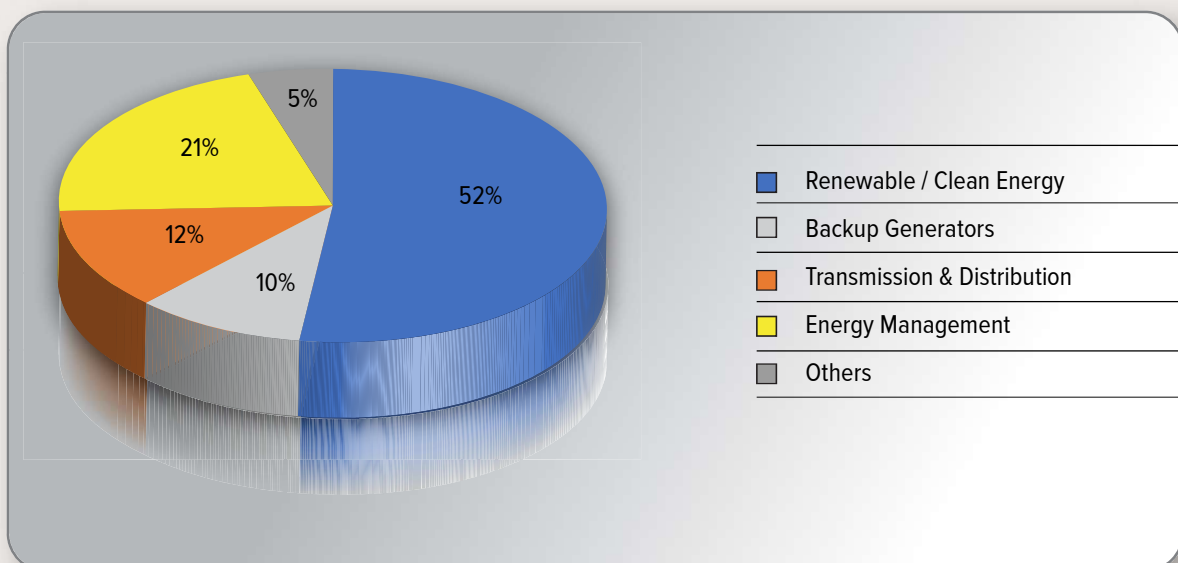


Visitor Analysis

PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF ATTENDEES

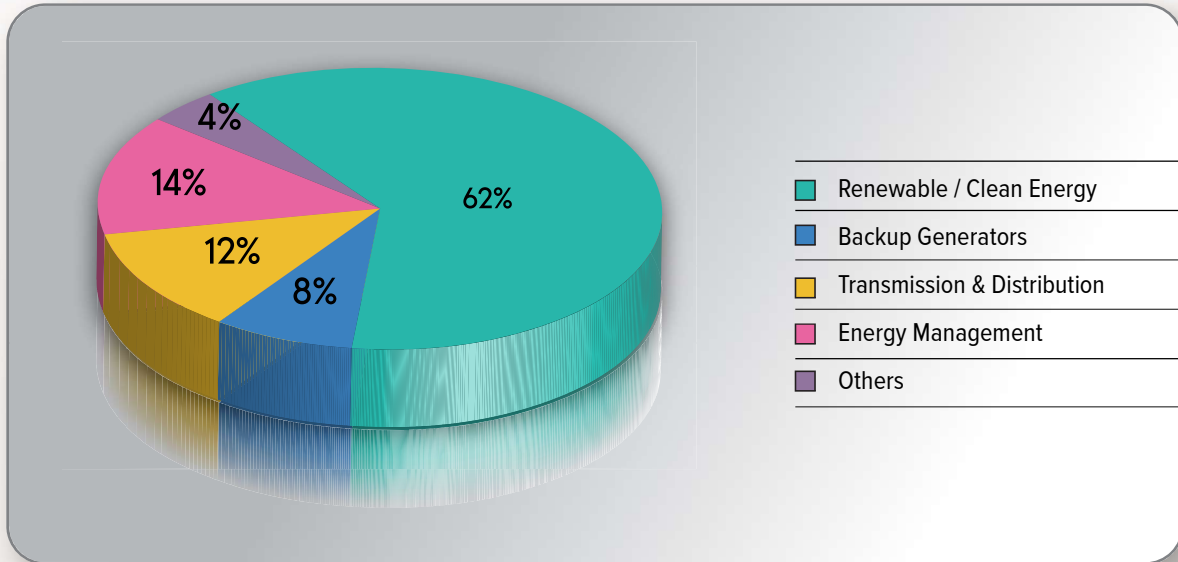


PERCENTAGE OF EXHIBITORS





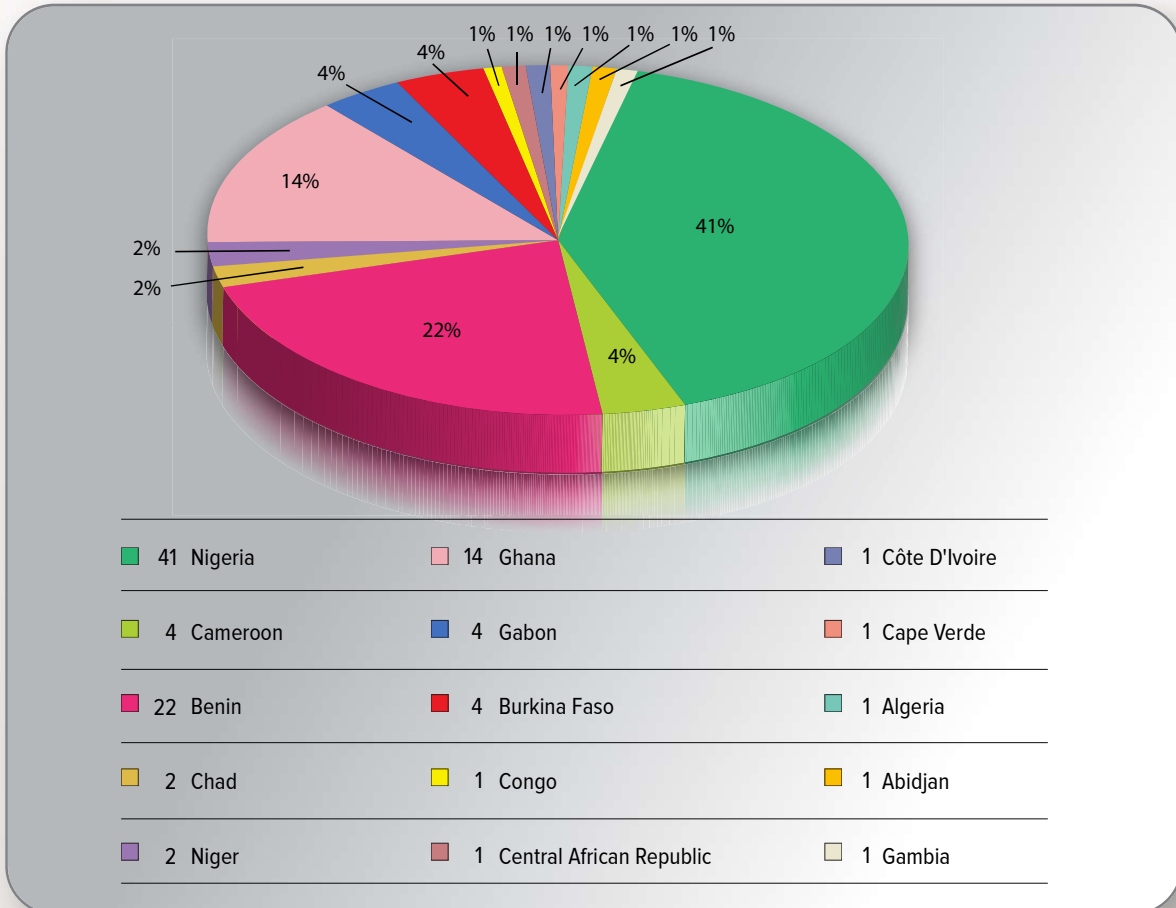
SECTOR OF INTEREST BY VISITORS



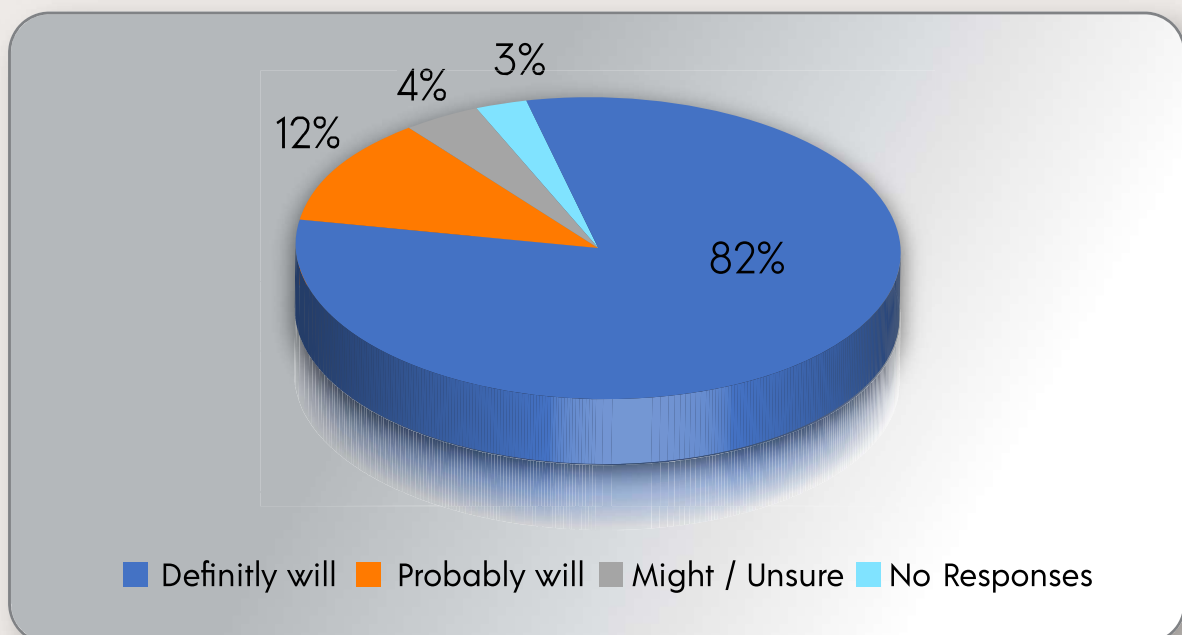
VISITOR ANALYSIS

Drowned victim's family appeals A'lbom corpse, cover open drainages in A'lbom

Family of Late Madam Elanre Akpan Ogon of Nnung Udo Udo family, Mr Oshong Ogon said the family had expected the state government to promptly cover the drainages to forestall a repeat of such occurrences.

The Agency asked what the family and community needed, we asked that the woman's corpse be recovered for proper burial, and that the gutters should be cleaned up to Michael Abraham and the sleep-covered to avoid future occurrences.

"On Sunday, they swabbed in and evacuated those machines. On Monday we called to find out why that was so, they told us the machines were rented from Njanfiet, not from the Ministry or Agency."

"So we called the family head, village head, youth president, we put heads together and decided to send a letter, inviting the state government to come and have a discussion with us, prominent on our demands was that we needed the corpse recovered for proper burial."

immediate recovery of the corpse and replacement of slaps on the gutters.

To return normally to the major street, Ministry of Environment and the Akwa Ibom State Environmental and Waste Management Agency, mobilised for search, with heavy machinery and equipment.

The Hon Commissioner for Environment, Sir Charles Udoh who spent the entire day at the scene of the incident assured that necessary measures were being taken to recover the corpse. Hon. Prince Ilim, Chairman of the agency directly in charge of waste management, when contacted, assured that efforts were in place to recover the corpse.

They swept down the line, and with Madam Ogon's corpse still hanging in the drainage, the family has expressed concerns that the search was not just abandoned after the initial effort, but that the gutters were still left open.
